(Point to the triangle.) Show me another one like this.

For children aged 4 - 6

Page 3 - 4

What will Spot draw next?
Why do you think Spot likes drawing birds?

Page 7 - 8

What is a starfish?
What would you do if you found a starfish?

Page 9 - 10

What is Spot doing in this picture?

Page 11 - 12

Why is Spot fishing?
What do you think Spot might do after fishing?

Activities to try at home

Scavenger Hunt

Look around the house for different shapes e.g. "find three things that are **circles**". If this is easy look for things with different colours and sizes e.g. "find something that is **square** and **yellow**" or "find a **big triangle.**"

Pairs

Use picture cards of shapes or make your own to play this game. Turn all the cards over so you can't see the shapes. Take it in turns to flip over two cards. If the shapes match the player keeps the cards. The player with the most cards at the end wins. Remember, **name the shapes** on the cards **together** so your child can learn them!
